Busiest Road in America

The National Road was once the busiest in America and Zane Grey wrote over 90 books. Visit the museum that tells their stories. Take a group picture by one of the artifacts found on the grounds.

Circle of the Vases

You don't need to bring flowers to this circle of vases. Take at least one team member's picture with their favorite vases.

Bronze Statues

Sheep walking down the sidewalk outside this studio should certainly get your attention. Take a picture of the youngest person in your group pretending to pet the sheep. Take some time to step inside and you might catch the artist at work.

River Boat Ride

Travel the Muskingum River on this riverboat or just take a group picture by its mooring site.

World Famous Bridge

You will find this historic bridge taking traffic over the confluence of the Licking and Muskingum rivers in downtown Zanesville. For the best view and to take a picture of your group with the bridge in the background, visit Putnam Hill Park's overlook.

Slip Sliding Away

Take a picture of all the kids in your group on the very long slide in the park on the hill. Adults can try it too!

The Doctor Is In

In 1801, the first physician came to the Zanesville area. Take a picture of someone pretending to take another group member's pulse. Be sure the house is in your background.

Open to Everyone

In 1917, people wanted this building open to farmers as well as to the town folk. So, for \$1 per year, everyone in the county could make use of the education resources. Take a picture of the oldest person in your group sitting on the steps of the oldest part of the historic building named for John McIntire.

St. Nicholas

Not Santa Claus, but an historic Roman Catholic Church. Take a picture of at least one member of your group in front of one of the beautiful windows of the church.

Still Standing After All These Years

This is the only public building still standing in Ohio from the early 1800's. It has served as many things including being a stop on the underground railroad. Take a group picture in front of this large stone structure.

Let the Good Times Roll

Since 1948, kids of all ages have been rolling around this wooden floor to the music and under the neon lights. Take a picture of at least two of your team pretending to skate across the lot. Be sure the building name is behind you.

Special Delivery

Keep an eye out for a delivery truck during your journey.

Ice Cream, Chocolates and Nuts

Two cousins started this local ice cream parlor in 1948. Stop by for some ice cream or grab some chocolates or cashews to go. Take a picture of your group enjoying ice cream or a group shot with the sign.

Higher Education

Zanesville has two institutes of higher education. Have the kids in your group pretend to be going off as they get their picture taken with one of the school signs.

The Secret Garden

This beautiful 7-acre urban garden is virtually undetected from the street but certainly worth the stop. Take a picture of the children in your group at the sign designating the Olga's Children's Garden section of the property.

Take a Walk

Genesis Hospital hides a beautiful area and fitness trail. Take a walk on the trail and take a group picture in the gazebo.

Outlook

A large bright red sculpture greets visitors to this local museum. David Black created the unique piece that should be the backdrop for your group picture at this location.

On My Honor

The local service center for the Girl Scouts is a "place for girls". Take a picture of all the girls in your group in front of the building or at the sign on the corner.

Initialize

As you travel through your day, find a license plate that has the first initial of at least two of you team members. Take their picture with the plate. Please be sure to stay a safe distance from the car to eliminate any concern from the car's owner.

The Story Begins Here

Take a walk in the woods at Dillon to experience the story that is shared along the way. Take a picture of the youngest member of your group enjoying one of the story screens.

Water Control

The Army Corps of Engineers built this water control structure in 1961. Take a walk/drive across the top then take a picture of the kids in your group playing leapfrog with it in the background.
